However, the one thing that has let

me down slightly has been my putting and my ability to score on occasions. However, I have put this down to all of the practice I have done on my swing as this has been a priority. Now, I am starting to work harder on my putting and just getting the ball in the hole so I am hoping things will start to come together on a regular basis and instead of just making cuts, having some great finishes.

I have to say that I am finding tour life a lot easier in comparison to last year. With last year being my first year, everything was new and it took me most of the season to settle in. Before I knew it, the season was over and that was it. I feel much more at ease this year in every sense. It is nice going to tournaments and knowing what to expect, it is nice knowing a lot of the players and I just feel in a better place with my golf this year in comparison to the 2006 season. I know I am capable of doing well this year and the tour is a really exciting arena to play in. Last year, in so many ways I didn't know what to expect and I wasn't terribly full of belief in my own ability. At the end of the day, it is a huge learning curve and I know that I will continue to learn each and every year out on tour. However, as each year or even as every tournament passes, I know in my own mind that this is what I want to do and I wouldn't change what I do for the world. I feel very privileged to playing the game I love for a living. Yes, the travel does get you down sometimes and I miss home and just day to day things but the pros certainly outweigh the cons.

It is nice seeing lots of familiar faces on tour, obviously, with this being my second year on The European Tour, you get to know people a lot better and everyone in general is very friendly. If you are sat on your own, there always seems to be someone around you can go and talk to if you feel like some company which is nice. However, there are a lot of new faces on tour this year, so hopefully I can make them feel as welcome as I was made to feel.

I was recently in Belfast for the Northern Ireland Open and it was nice to finally meet with Mark and Marcella from Chaka Travel. They were both very friendly and it was obviously nice to catch up and get to know them, and to finally put a face to a name. We had a great



time together and I enjoyed their company. I thank them and really appreciate, as always, for their continued help and support throughout this year on tour.
